Arulmigu Kalyana Pasupatheeswarar Temple

Pasupatheeswarar Temple is the landmark of Karur City. Group of sculptures representing Pasupatheeswarar Lingam, milk oozing cow and Rangamatha are adding more attraction to the temple.



Arulmigu Mariamman Temple

A temple dedicated to Sri Mariamman is located at heart of the city is famous here. All people irrespective of caste and creed participate in Kumbam Festival celebrated during the month of May every year. The sacred water is brought from the river Amaravathi by all the devotees to this famous temple for worshipping, during this glorious event.



Kalyana Venkataramana Swamy Temple, Thanthonimalai

Thanthonimalai is located 5 kms away from Karur and has a temple dedicated to Lord Kalyana Venkataramana Swamy situated at a raised portion of the hillock. This temple is also known as Then Thirupathi (South Thirupathi).



Vennamalai

This place is famous for the temple dedicated to Lord Murugan located on Karur - Salem road at a distance of 5 kms from Karur. The Hindu exponents such as Arunagirinadhar and Avvaiyar sung their Hymns to praise this Lord.




Sri Sadhasiva Brahmendra Adhistanam (Jeeva Samadhi), Nerur

Some holy places are capable of bestowing immense peace to all those who are blessed to visit. Sadhasiva Brahmendra attained Jeeva Samadhi in 1750 A.D. in Nerur. He fulfilled the wish of his ardent disciple Raja Vijaya Raghunatha Thondaiman, that he should settle down in land that belonged to the king. Here, the river Cauveri flows south (dakshina), which adds sanctity to this place. The Adhistanam is located in Nerur, a village 14 kms from Karur.



Government Museum

It is located at Old Dindigul Road, Jawahar Bazar, Karur. The museum was opened to public in 2000. The specimens displayed include bronze items, metal-ware objects, musical instruments, coins, rocks and minerals, fossils, botanical specimens, molluscan shells and other marine specimens. Educational activities of the Museum includes Guide services, popular lectures, etc.



Puhazhimalai

A Temple dedicated to Lord Subramanya on a small hill at Velayuthampalayam near Pugalur is famous for its sculptures. This is situated in the North West of Karur on the bank of river Cauvery.




Arulmigu Kadambaneswarar Temple

Ayyermalai



Every year Brahmotchavam Festival for 15 days, Chithirai Festival, Thaipoosam Festival, Karthigai Festival, Panguni Uthiram Festival and Theppam Festival are celebrated here in a grand manner.



Ponnaniar Dam

Ponnaniar Dam is a picnic spot located near Pooncholai village of Kadavoor hill region in Karur district. This dam has been constructed at the foot of Semmalai. It has provided irrigation facilities to the surrounding villages. Public Works Department maintains the dam site.





Thirumukkudalur

A/m. Agatheeswarar temple is situated in Thirumukkudalur very near to Karur and it is under the control of the HR & CE department. The rivers Cauvery, Amaravathi and Manimuthaaru confluence together in this place. Thus, this place is named as Thirumukkudal. This temple was built by Rajendra Chola-I of Chola Dynasty, People believed that Agathiya Munivar worshipped Lord Shiva in this temple.



Mayanur Barrage

This is a picnic spot of Karur. Mayanur Barrage is one of the famous tourist attractions in Karur District. It is 23 Kms from Karur and 21 Kms from Kulithalai which is situated on the bank of the River Cauvery.
